Course Overview: The L-449 Incident Command System (ICS) 100-400 Train the Trainer course prepares participants to deliver the Emergency Management Institute's Incident Command System curriculum. While ICS 100 and 200 courses are addressed, the major emphasis is on ICS 300 and 400.

Participants must be able to demonstrate a working knowledge of ICS through experience and/or training and previously attended classes in adult education.

Prerequisites: ICS 100, ICS 200, ICS 300, ICS 400, IS 700 and IS 800 courses. Participants must have worked as an Incident Commander, command or general staff positions on incidents that went longer than one operational period or involved in a written action plan or involved in multi-agency coordination. Students must provide proof of successful completion of all courses on the first day of class. If you need information on obtaining these prerequisites, you may contact our office.
