

THERAPY DOG TRAINING (6ACE 243). This program assists people who have a wide variety of mobility impairments to train their own dog to be a fully certified Service Dog. These dogs receive special training that includes basic and advanced obedience, public access manners and task specific skills before being allowed to test for public access certification. Class will be need specific for the following areas:

Therapy Dog Program - If you have ever thought it would be fun to take your dog on a visit to those living in a nursing home, hospital or assisted living facility this course is for you. Dogs entering this program should be of sound temperament. The dog for this program can be of any size.

Hearing Assistance Dog Program - Hearing dogs are schooled to alert to specific sounds needed by their partners, primarily in the home setting. Some hearing dogs also work outside the home, alerting to specific sounds in public settings. Dogs entering this program should be of sound temperament. The dog for this program can be of any size

Autism Service Dog Program - The Autism Service Dog Program works closely with the entire family of an autistic child to train the canine to perform tasks suited for the individual child. Dogs entering this program must be of sound temperament. Puppies will be accepted into this program.
