DEFENSIVE SHOOTING *FOR MEN AND WOMEN (BASIC) (6ACE 275). Students provide their own handguns and ammo. Students should meet at the Williamson County Armory. Do not bring guns to the first session. A certificate will be given upon successful completion of the course. Course will encourage responsible, safe handling of firearms and ammunition and ethical conduct. The Illinois Self Defense Law, handgun and ammunition section, legal issues, proper shooting techniques and more will be discussed. Students will spend a lot of time on the range on practical shooting exercises.

DEFENSIVE SHOOTING *REFUSE TO BE A VICTIM/PERSONAL PROTECTION IN THE HOME (6ACE 275). The students will learn how to take steps to secure their homes and their persons to avoid being a victim but how to protect themselves should the need arise. Students will also be taught the potential psychological, physiological and legal aftermaths of an encounter with a violent person. 100% attendance is required for a certificate. This course is a prerequisite for Personal Protection Outside the Home. Sessions five, six and seven will be held outside at the range TBA in class.

FIREARM SAFETY EDUCATION *HOME FIREARM SAFETY/BASIC PISTOL (6ACE 232). In this course the student will learn how to safely handle, store and shoot a firearm. Focus will be on firearm safety but will also include types of firearms, types of ammunition, safe gun handling and introduction to shooting skills. Sessions five and six will be held outside at the range TBA in class. 100% attendance is required for certificate. This course is a prerequisite for the Personal Protection in the Home course.

UTAH CONCEAL CARRY PERMIT (CFP) (FOR NON RESIDENTS) (PS 766). The Utah CFP permit training class takes 4 hours. Firing of a firearm is not required to obtain the Non-Resident Utah concealed firearm permit. The permit is valid for 5 years and training is not required for renewal. This permit is perfect for people who travel and want to legally protect themselves and their family. Students will receive fingerprint cards and photo will be taken at class.



Utah concealed firearm permit is recognized by 30 states for Illinois Residents. Alabama, Alaska, Arizona, Arkansas, Delaware, Georgia, Idaho, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Louisiana, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Vermont, Virginia, Washington State, West Virginia, Wisconsin and Wyoming. *Class cost does not include the \$65.00 registration fee to the state of Utah. Students may be qualified to apply for the Florida Non-Resident CFP Permit. Instructor will provide complete application packets and photo service.
