

## ***Health Care***

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**ARC: CLIENT CASEWORK: PROVIDING EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (MED 110).** This course is intended for Red Cross employees and volunteers who are interested in acquiring the knowledge and skills needed to conduct client interviews and provide emergency disaster assistance to clients.
