To verify that you provided correct information, the financial aid office at John A. Logan College will compare your FAFSA with the information on this worksheet and with any other required documents. If there are differences, your FAFSA information may need to be corrected. You must complete and sign this worksheet, attach any required documents, and submit the form and other required documents to the financial aid office at John A. Logan College. John A. Logan College may ask for additional information. If you have questions about verification, contact the financial aid office at John A. Logan College as soon as possible so that your financial aid will not be delayed.

B. Independent Student's Family Information

C. Independent Student’s Income Information to Be Verified

- 1. TAX RETURN FILERS - Important Note:** If you (or your spouse, if married) filed, or will file, an amended 2016 IRS tax return, the student must contact the financial aid office as soon as possible. *If you (and your spouse, if married) filed separate 2016 tax returns, 2016 IRS tax return transcripts must be submitted for each person.*

D. High school Completion Status

You must submit documentation of high school completion or an equivalent along with this worksheet.

Check the box of the document you will attach to this worksheet:

- A copy of the student's final official high school transcript including graduation date.
- For students who completed secondary education in a foreign country, a copy of the "secondary school leaving certificate" or other similar document.
- A state certificate or transcript received by a student after the student passed a State-authorized examination that the State recognizes as the equivalent of a high school diploma (GED test, HiSET, TASC, or other State-authorized examination).
- Academic transcript of a successfully completed two-year program acceptable for full credit toward a bachelor's degree.
- For a student who was homeschooled in a state where state law requires the student to obtain a secondary school completion credential for homeschooling (other than a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent), a copy of that credential.
- For a student who was homeschooled in a state where state law does not require the student to obtain a secondary school completion credential for homeschooling (other than a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent), a transcript, or the equivalent, signed by the student's parent or guardian, that lists the secondary school courses the student completed and includes a statement that the student successfully completed a secondary school education in a homeschool setting.

E. Documentation of Identity/Statement of Educational Purpose

In order to complete the Verification process, you will need to appear in person at John A. Logan College and present your unexpired valid government-issued photo identification (ID), such as, but not limited to, a driver's license, other state-issued ID, or passport. The institution will maintain a copy of the student's photo ID that is annotated by the institution with the date it was received and reviewed, and the name of the official at the institution authorized to receive and review the student's ID.

In addition, the student must sign, in the presence of the institutional official, the Statement of Educational Purpose provided below.

Identity and Statement of Educational Purpose (To Be Signed in the Presence of a Notary)

If you are unable to appear in person at John A. Logan College to verify your identity, you must provide to the institution:

- (a) A copy of the unexpired valid government-issued photo identification (ID) that is acknowledged in the notary statement below, or that is presented to a notary, such as, but not limited to, a driver's license, other state-issued ID, or passport; and
- (b) The original Statement of Educational Purpose provided below, which must be notarized. If the notary statement appears on a separate page than the Statement of Educational Purpose, there must be a clear indication that the Statement of Educational Purpose was the document notarized.
