## NOTES AND INFORMATION

\* Students must complete either CHM 141 OR BIO 226 PRIOR to starting the ADN program. Students must also maintain "C" or higher in all courses. All students must complete the practical nursing curriculum. All PN courses must be completed with a "C" or better prior to beginning ADN courses. It is strongly recommended that all ADN general education courses are completed prior to beginning the ADN program. Active and unencumbered Illinois LPN license is required prior to entering the first year, fall semester classes. The following courses are included in the minimum hours of this degree:
