

What Does That Mean?

Accreditation is a Seal of Approval that says JALC has met high standards and is committed to continuous improvement.



Quality Education Accreditation means JALC is providing a quality education that meets national standards.



Transferring Credit Hours

To transfer credits to an accredited school, your credits must come from a school with accreditation. Without accreditation, your credit hours don't count!



Financial Aid

Only schools that are accredited are eligible to offer federal and state financial aid to their students.



Employment

Employers value accredited schools more highly and many will not hire applicants who earned their degrees at non-accredited schools.



How Does JALC Get Accreditation?



JALC participates in the Open Pathway process which integrates all Higher Learning Commission processes and requests for data into the reaffirmation of accreditation cycle.

What is Open Pathways?

Open Pathways is a process for maintaining accreditation that features a Quality Initiative and Assurance Reviews which are conducted in Years 4 and 10.



Quality Initiative

As part of the Open Pathways Process for Accreditation, JALC is participating in a Quality Initiative: Assessment Academy.



Criteria for Accreditation

The Higher Learning Commission's Criteria for Accreditation are the standards of quality by which the Commission determines whether an institution merits reaffirmation of accreditation.



Criterion One:

Mission

The institution's mission is clear and articulated publicly; it guides the institution's operations.



Criterion Two: Integrity: Ethical and Responsible Conduct

The institution acts with integrity; its conduct is ethical and responsible.



Criterion Three: Teaching and Learning: Quality, Resources, and Support

The institution provides high quality education, wherever and however its offerings are delivered.



Criterion Four: Teaching and Learning: Evaluation and Improvement

The institution demonstrates responsibility for the quality of its educational programs, learning environments, and support services, and it evaluates their effectiveness for student learning through processes designed to promote continuous improvement.



Criterion Five: Resources, Planning, and Institutional Effectiveness

The institution's resources, structures, and processes are sufficient to fulfill its mission, improve the quality of its educational offerings, and respond to future challenges and opportunities. The institution plans

for the future.

JOHN A. LOGAN COLLEGE'S CURRENT PRESIDENT IS DR. RON HOUSE.


