#### **Rating Scale**

# $1\ point$ - Minimal completion of the assigned task. Minimal demonstration of required knowledge

• The student makes an effort but falls very short, possibly missing some required elements.

- Student responses may be unrelated to the assigned task.
- There may be very little ratable material.

## 2 points - Partial completion of the task, interpretation mostly appropriate yet undeveloped

- Student answers are relevant but lack appropriate details and interpretation lacks development (only the gist of the text is interpreted).
- A required portion of the text may be missing or knowledge may be lacking.

#### 3 points - Completion of the task, interpretation adequately developed

- Interpretation has sufficient information and detail.
- Skills demonstrate adequate development and consistency.
- Student demonstrates organizational skills while completing the task and responses indicate acquisition of the required knowledge.

## 4 points - Superior completion of the task, interpretation appropriate and with elaboration

- All required elements are present and knowledge of the material is fully demonstrated.
- Interpretation includes a variety of vocabulary and language structures.
- Interpretation is usually well organized and cohesive.
