Baccalaureate Degree Requirements

Each candidate for a bachelor's degree must complete the requirements listed:

Hour Requirements. Student must complete at least 120 semester hrs of credit. Each student must have at least 42 hrs in courses that number 300 or above from a four-year institution.

Residence Requirements. Student must complete the residency requirement by taking a total of 42 semester hrs at SIU Carbondale.

Grade Point Average Requirements. Music Education students must earn a minimum of a *C* in each course required for licensure.

Licensure Requirement. Music education students need to apply for admission into the Teacher Education Program (TEP) before beginning their fourth last semester. Admission deadlines are August 15 and January 10 for fall and spring semesters respectively.

Compact Agreement

SIU recognizes Illinois regionally accredited community college transferable baccalaureate-oriented Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degrees under the Compact Agreement since 1970. SIU will continue to recognize the baccalaureate oriented associate degree (A.A. or A.S. degree) under the Illinois Articulation Initiative as satisfying SIU University Core Curriculum (UCC). The Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.), Associate in Engineering Science (A.E.S.), the Associate in General Studies (A.G.S.), and the Associate in Fine Arts (A.F.A.) are not covered under the Compact Agreement and do not carry the same benefits as the A.A. and A.S. degrees.

Dual Admission Program

The Dual Admission Program (DAP) allows baccalaureate-oriented students at eligible community colleges to benefit from pre-advisement for a chosen major at SIU Carbondale. DAP addresses specific requirements that a student may not automatically fulfill by completing an associate degree. Students apply to DAP by completing the Application for Undergraduate Admission and indicating interest in the program. Students must have at least two semesters remaining at their community college to participate, attend an eligible community college, and select a participating SIU major.

Saluki Transfer Pathways

<u>Saluki Transfer Pathways</u> is the university's dual admission program that allows students at eligible community colleges intending to transfer to SIU to benefit from early admission and pre-advisement for a baccalaureate program at Southern Illinois University Carbondale. Saluki Transfer Pathways allows students to be conditionally admitted to SIU Carbondale up to two years in advance of their intended transfer term so they have access to the university's degree audit system and transfer credit evaluation. DegreeWorks is an easy-to-use, online degree audit tool specifically designed for students. Once admitted to SIU Carbondale, you can use it monitor your progress toward your degree in Salukinet.

Saluki Transfer Estimator Portal (STEP)

The <u>Saluki Transfer Estimator Portal</u> (STEP) is a web-based tool that integrates institutional course equivalency and degree audit data to provide an unofficial credit estimation and a more seamless transfer process. STEP gives transfer students a clear roadmap for timely degree completion by providing key information about how transfer credits apply to your intended program at SIU.
