**How Articulation Agreement Works**

- The plan leads to a Bachelor of Science degree in Behavioral Health with a concentration in Alcohol and Other Drug Counseling at Illinois College. Students will fill out applications for both schools and consult the advisors and catalogs from both schools for specifics. This completion guide is designed to ensure graduation in four years by taking courses full-time at both John A. Logan College and Illinois College. This guide assumes students have met all course prerequisites required by John A. Logan College and admission requirements for Illinois College.
- Upon completion of the first two years' requirements at John A. Logan College, students will receive an Associate in Arts degree (A.A.) concentrating in Social Work.
- A minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 should be achieved for admission and maintained at Illinois College to graduate as a Behavioral Health major. Only courses with grades of C- or better will transfer to IC.
- Students can transfer up to 88 semester credit hours.
- Students will be required to complete all major requirements at Illinois College and any remaining general education and graduation requirements.

Elective hours needed to reach 120 semester credit hours

Notes for Illinois College:

1. A minimum of 120 semester credit hours are needed for graduation.
2. A minimum GPA of 2.0 will be required overall, in the major, and any minor(s).
3. Thirty-two semester hours must be taken at IC.
4. Upon graduation, students can sit for the Certified Counselor and Other Drug (CADC) licensure exam in Illinois.
5. This program can be completed either on-campus or online.
