## A. Athletic Housing Contracts

The College has scholarship agreements with members of the athletic teams who contract with off-campus housing providers. The contracts for 2011 fall and 2012 spring semesters with **Aspen Court-SIU**, **LLC**, Carbondale, Illinois total **\$130,194.72** (women's basketball \$36,288, men's basketball \$36,288, baseball \$57,618.72).

**Recommendation:** That the Board of Trustees approve the housing contracts for John A. Logan College women's basketball, men's basketball, and baseball for 2011 fall semester and 2012 spring semester in the amount of **\$130,194.72** to **Aspen**

#### I. <u>Customer Support Service Plan</u>

Cost for basic software support with Education Solutions Development (ESD) will not increase for fiscal year 2012 and the College's monthly charge will remain at \$8,656.

The College has been running APECS software in some form since 1981 and has a tremendous investment in training, knowledge, and historical data that cannot be replaced for a dollar figure anywhere near what we are presently paying for APECS software and support. We feel with the major dependence our institution has on our computer system,

we must keep it running as effectively and efficiently as possible. As a result of this service plan, we will continue to receive:

- Hotline Telephone Support

- Web Help Support

- Updates to APECS programs

- Remote Diagnostics

- Support via E-mail

We continue to monitor the improvements that ESD makes in the system through new releases, updates, federal and state mandated updates and other enhancements to the APECS product.

**Recommendation:** That the Board of Trustees authorize the administration to continue the agreement for customer support service with Education Solutions Development (ESD) for the period July 1, 2011, to June 30, 2012, for the amount of \$103,872.

# J. Network Switch Upgrades

In order to be able to meet ongoing and future College needs as part of the Sustainability and Technology Plans, Information Technology is recommending a plan to upgrade the switches used within the network. The College currently uses Cisco switches that will not be supported past 2015. Thus, it is important to begin a switch replacement process that will last for seven or eight years. The oldest Cisco switches will be replaced each year. For FY 2012, seven 48 port switches will replace fourteen 24 port switches in E127. The new switches will include Power over Ethernet (PoE) capability so that Voice over Internet Protocol phones can be implemented during this seven or eight year replacement cycle.

Quotes for seven Juniper EX4200 48 port switches have been gathered.

**Recommendation:** That the Board of Trustees approves the purchase of seven Juniper EX4200 48 port switches from CDW-G for the amount of \$64,457.75 as part of the Technology Plan, and that the administration be authorized to purchase this equipment.

#### K. Network Equipment (Storage Area Network (SAN)

Purchase of a Storage Area Network (SAN) would provide the College several benefits. Each employee would be provided a secure directory on the SAN to store work files. This directory would be accessible only by the employees and Information Technology system administrators. Data on the SAN would become part of the backup plan, to tape stored offsite in the event of a disaster and in "snapshot" form on disk. The snapshot function would allow files to be restored quickly in the event users inadvertently delete data. In using the SAN, the College's physical security of data will be improved as the SAN will reside in a controlled environment. A centralized configuration will also provide more effective methods to encrypt and secure user data than the present state where users store data locally on their computer's hard drive. Files on the SAN could be accessed securely from offcampus via Virtual Private Network (VPN) allowing flexibility for employees to access needed data.

<u>Recommendation</u>: That the Board of Trustees approve the purchase of a Storage Area Network from 710 Bookstore, Carbondale, Illinois for the amount of \$55,314.43, and authorize the administration to purchase this equipment.

## L. Computer Purchases

One hundred sixty-seven computers need to be purchased using the agreement the College has with Dell and 710 Bookstore to fill needs in academic areas. These computers will replace older machines in academic labs in accordance with the Sustainable Financial and Technology Plans, and are to be in place by fall semester 2011. Specifically, 21 desktop computers each will be used to replace machines in each Short Term Instruction lab H123 and H125, 26 in Secretarial lab E130, and 25, 21 and 22 in Business labs E132, E201 and E203 respectively. Labs that use laptops being replaced are Geology lab G106A (2), Physics lab G122 (21), and Dental labs D169 (2) and D174A (6).

<u>Recommendation</u>: That the Board of Trustees approve the quote of \$177,482.65 for the purchase 167 computers from 710 Bookstore, Carbondale, Illinois, and that the administration be authorized to purchase this equipment.

#### M. Smart Classroom Equipment for the Communication Wing

In accordance with Board Policy #7154, Sec. 2, Item #e and 110 ILCS 805/3-27.1, Item f, which exempts bidding for purchases of telecommunications and inter-connect equipment, the administration is requesting to purchase the Smart Classroom equipment for the new Communication Wing from Central Indiana Marketing in the amount of \$179,027. This equipment is for 26 classrooms and one conference room.

**Recommendation:** That the Board of Trustees approve this purchase of Smart Classroom equipment for 26 classrooms and one conference room from Central Indiana Marketing in the amount of \$179,027, and authorize the administration to purchase this equipment.

#### N. <u>Permission to Utilize Joint Purchasing Contracts for Furniture</u>

Board Policy 7154, Purchasing and 110 ILCS 805/3-27.2, Joint Purchases, provide for use of joint purchasing contracts. Historically, joint purchasing has been utilized for furniture and equipment associated with occupancy of newly constructed or renovated spaces. The administration is requesting approval for this method of purchasing to equip the new Communication Wing. The College would be using the State of Illinois pricing schedule with the vendor, Virco. The estimated cost for all furnishings, classroom, lounge, and office, is \$210,194.62.

**Recommendation:** That the Board of Trustees approve this method of purchasing classroom, lounge and office furnishings for the new Communication Wing, and authorize the administration to proceed with the purchase from Virco in the amount of \$210,194.62.

#### O. Treasurer's Bond

The Treasurer's Bond that the Board of Trustees has in effect on Brad McCormick is up for renewal. This bond in the amount of \$5,000,000 is issued by Liberty Mutual Surety through Consolidated Insurance Agency, Inc. of Carbondale. It is required by law that such a bond be on file in each of the counties of the district, the office of the regional superintendent of schools, and the ICCB office. The premium for this term of June 27, 2011 to June 27, 2012 is \$4,500 and is paid from Liability and Protection Funds. The premium is the same amount as last year's premium.

**Recommendation:** That the Board of Trustees approve the Treasurer's Bond with Liberty Mutual Surety in the amount of \$5,000,000 for the premium of \$4,500, and that the administration is authorized to implement this bond coverage as required by law.
